



General Meeting

Meeting called to order at 10am.

1. Approval of Minutes

- Minutes were approved as posted on website

2. Treasurer's Report

- \$3,270.33 (includes all expenses to date)

3. President's Report

- New officers were introduced: Delores Garbarini, President; Peggy Threadgill, Vice-President; Vicky Aranda, Treasurer; Carol Goodman, Secretary.
- Garden Managers were introduced: Bill Griffin, Greenhouse; Steve Lindner, East Garden; Vicki Branscome, West Garden; Kay Hampton, Far West Garden; Sandy Balch, Cutting Garden
- There will be a new garden area in Neighborhood 3. It will be the Far East Garden. The shed is already built (including electricity). The new raised beds are 2'x2'x6' and will be tentatively available in mid to late 2026.
- Residents are not to visit the area yet because it is a construction site.
- Delores handed out a chart indicating how the members' dues have been spent in 2024 and 2025. The amount spent in 2025 was less than 2024. However, due to the addition of the Far East Garden, more could be spent in 2026.
- Safety
 - a) Delores mentioned safety in the gardens will be a priority in 2026.
 - b) Always carry your cellphone and water with you to the garden. It is not a good idea to drink from hoses unless it is an emergency.
 - c) Always wear a hat to protect yourself from the sun
